The Camden Public Library will celebrate National Library Week with a series of events that launch our Campaign for the Future. “This year’s National Library Week theme is ‘Libraries = Strong Communities.’ That couldn’t be more fitting as we invite the community to join our effort to support our library both today and tomorrow,” Executive Director Nikki Maounis said. “If we want the library to be able to keep offering the programs, services, and beautiful setting that we all know today, we need everyone’s support. We look forward to sharing news of how our community can help.” This \$2.5 million fundraising effort will provide the long-term sustainability and help permanently support the library’s work in the community. So far, friends and neighbors of the library have quietly raised \$1.5 million toward that goal. 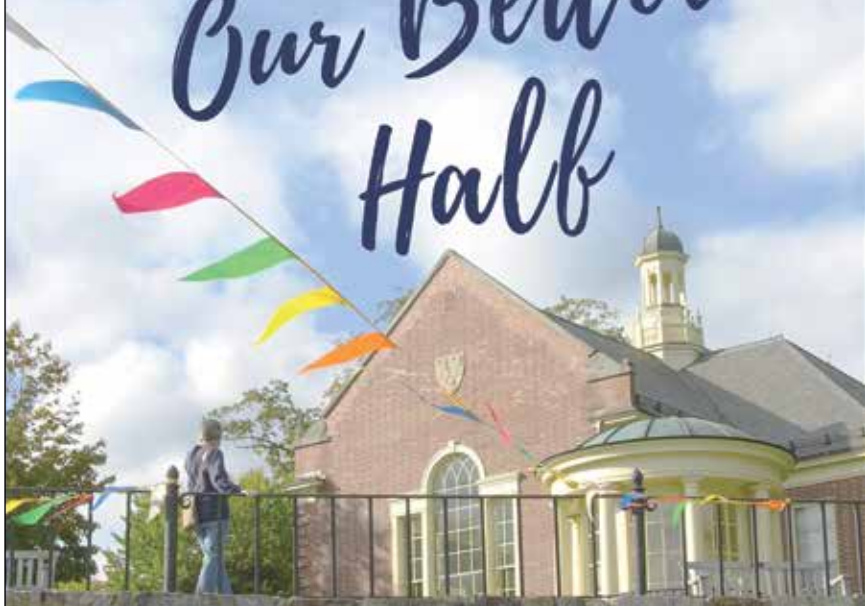
