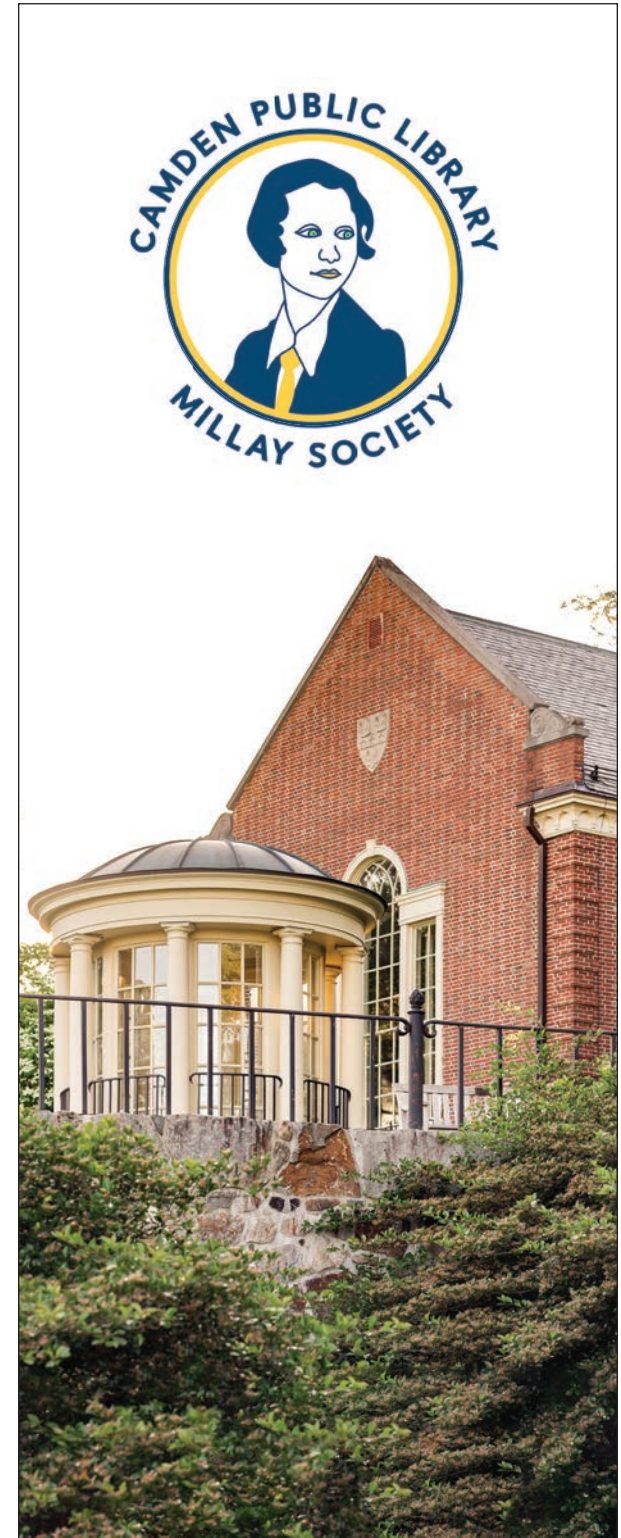

The Millay Society is a small group of community members who support the library with an annual gift of at least \$1,500 (or \$125 monthly).

Since its 2006 founding, the Society has helped fund the collections; cultural and educational programs; and upkeep of the historic building, Amphitheatre, and Harbor Park.

The Society is named in honor of poet and writer Edna St. Vincent Millay (1892-1950). Raised in Camden, she was the first woman to win the Pulitzer Prize in poetry.
